The Cultural Specialist class is for personnel who wish to serve as a Heritage Consultant, READ or REAF on fire incidents, in a cultural role. It is **not intended** for those who serve on fire crews. The class does **NOT** include fireline training, a Basic 32 or a pack test. Boots would be an advantage for the field trip, but PPE is not required. The second day is given partly in the field. Pre-requisites: pack test (Feb 19), Basic 32 Fire School (Feb 8-12)
