Dave Webb – Friends of the Shasta River: Cited need for public involvement in grants review process to be easier and timelier. In the past, applicants have come to the process too late or have had trouble finding projects on the website. NCRP should make public input easier. Not all projects are good ones so input on projects in important. There is need for improving opportunities for public input and oversite because it is helpful when the public points out things that NCRP staff are not aware of. Recommended the creation of a listserv for upcoming projects so that public input can be given more easily.

NCRP Co-Chairs Hillman and Gore, TPRC Co-Chairs, Staff Team

Co-chair Hillman:

- Touched on fuel reduction, forest management, troublesome junipers, biomass, wildfire, capacity building, workforce development, prescribed fire, cultural fire, insurance, climate change, cannabis, wind energy, Tribes, counties, and economic development.
- Priorities are things that we have common ground on, such as fire. In order to move forward and get these things done, strong participation of new leadership council members is needed.

Co-chair Gore:

Described that the NCRP had expanded its portfolio of projects from water-related projects to
include fire prevention, forest health and other climate action projects. There is great value in
the partnerships with state agencies. Other topics pertained to the internal capacity to scale
and long-term sustainability and the need for succession planning. Also there was a discussion
about conducting integrated strategic plans rather than program-specific separate plans. We
need to continue and expand opportunities to connect and create synergies in an intentional
manner.

Emeritus Chair McKenzie:

Acknowledged that the spirit of the group and how it functions is the same as the original goals.
 Tribes and counties functioning as partners and leaders is inspiring. Make sure to let people outside know what we do, how we do it, and our success.

Supervisor Madrone:

 Questioned if NCRP is ready to scale up and looks forward to engaging with agency folks regarding constraints and how they can help NCRP help communities.
